

A LOOK BACK and A VISION FOR THE FUTURE


Dear Friends.

For over four decades we have watched our community health center clinics serve, thrive and expand on our West Dallas clinic campus. This year concludes our second year to serve, thrive and expand at the LBU Health Center in South Oak Cliff!

Fiscal year 2017-2018 was a "chart-topping" year! The organization served 25,000 patients, which amounts to a 14% increase from the previous year. Our clinicians were busy, not only with the new patients, but with a 20% increase of patient visits, totaling 84,000. The newer LBU Health Center undoubtedly filled an unmet need in the community, proving what we knew; we are exactly where we need to be...until our next expansion into another greatly underserved community. Yes, we have an exciting vision for the future.

We could not have achieved such success without your support of both our flagship West Dallas facilities and the LBU Health Center. Dr. G Dedication


In honor of our beloved Dr.
