WHAT A YEAR IT WAS...

Patient Access Increased!

More patients benefitted from more visits this past year because we

are committed to the "advanced access" model. The core principle of "advanced access" is that patients calling to schedule a doctor's visit are offered an appointment on the same day. In less than one year, the odds of patients seeing their own personal physician has dramatically increased, while delays have decreased. This, in turn, leads



to improved compliance with prevention guidelines, improved care for patients with chronic illness, and early detection of serious illness. Claudia Aroni, Director of Health Information Management.

Routine HIV Testing Program Grant Award

A Routine HIV Testing Program was implemented at Los Barrios Unidos and testing is now provided to uninsured

patients at no cost through a grant from the Texas Department of State Health Services. CDC recommends that individuals aged 13-64 get tested at least once in their lifetimes and those with risk factors get tested at least annually. 


Crystal Charity Ball Works Miracles!
