What a banner year it has been for Los Barrios Unidos Community Clinic! Fiscal year 2016-20167brought the eagerly anticipated opening of our newest clinic in Oak Cliff, the LBU Health Center. We celebrated with a



wonderful Grand Opening, followed by a community Christmas party! Our first day of service was Halloween Day, October 31, 2016. By May 31, 2016, our fiscal yearend, the LBU Health Center had served 3,600 patients!

Thank you to the many corporations, foundations and individuals who provided funding to help us build and operate the new facility, including a lead capital grant from the Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA), and a Crystal Charity Ball grant supporting a two-year launch of pediatric services. Many of these benefactors are recognized on the back page of this annual report, and on our *Giving Tree*, proudly displayed on the donor wall in the new clinic's spacious lobby.

This past year also saw significant expansion of innovative, model medical practices: The Promotora de Salud and Shared Medical Appointment programs with their focus on group appointments, group learning, and patient-centered control of pediatric asthma. We also launched our Blindness Prevention program, which, from the outset, has been thwarting blindness from unchecked diabetic retinopathy. Please do read more about these outstanding disease management approaches in this annual report. These programs are generously funded through grants from Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Texas, the Cigna Foundation and the Hoblitzelle Foundation.

The winning combination of philanthropy and exemplary medical staff also helped ensure that over 2,300 uninsured, low income adults received flu shots and other critical vaccinations for only \$5 thanks to a grant from the Hillcrest Foundation and Frost Bank.

Under the sound leadership of the Board of Directors and Leadership Team we strive, always, to do more; to improve health outcomes, to offer more programs and services in collaboration with like-minded organizations and individuals.

We invite you to take a look at this year's annual report for a snapshot of our growth and evolution. We thank you for your support of that growth!

#### The LBU Health Center Opens!

The LBU Health Center, a 21,400 square foot state-ofthe-art facility, opened its doors on October 31, 2016. On November 3rd, we celebrated our Grand Opening with over 200 in attendance, including elected officials,



collaborating organizations, and many special friends and supporters.

#### **Community Christmas Party!**

Nearly 400 community residents came out for photos with Santa at the LBU Health Center on December 16th. Santa came with bags full of toys! Families enjoyed a festive holiday atmosphere with music and a holiday treats buffet. Personal tours of the new facility lead to a number of new patient registrations onthe-spot!



#### The Promotores de Salud Program

Private donations supported a new Promotores de Salud program, improving family engagement in primary care and health outcomes for pediatric patients with asthma. The program leverages the Shared Medical Appointment (SMA) model. Promotora de Salud is Spanish for community health worker. Promotores are an indis-



pensable bridge between the community and health care providers.

#### Shared Medical Appointments (SMAs)

SMAs offer an innovative, interactive approach to health care that

brings patients with a common diagnosis together in a group setting with a healthcare team that includes a doctor, a Promotora and a Registered Nurse. Ten to fifteen asthma patients



and their families receive education and a one-on-one visit with a doctor. This setting encourages questions, shared concerns and experiences, and improves learning and patient satisfaction.

#### The LBU Giving Tree

The *LBU Giving Tree* grows proudly in the grand lobby of our new clinic. Donors leave a legacy by having their name permanently on display in the main lobby with an engraved leaf, dove or stone. Names on the *Giving Tree* demonstrate the commitment of so many to ensure that every family has the chance to receive
